Ask any collector plate aficionado who their favorite artists are, and you'll likely hear of Bill and Charlotte Hallett.

Over the past 50 years, the Haverhill, Mass., couple gained international acclaim for their vibrant collectible housewares. Many feature religious, nature and other themes, and were produced

in partnership with Steuben Glass and Hutschenreuther.

"I've honestly lost count of how many plates we've created," said Bill, who recently moved to Haverhill Crossings.

Though Charlotte passed away last

year, Bill continues his work at Haverhill Crossings -- teaching resident art classes, and recently showed off his latest collection of drawings at a community-wide event.

Bill fondly recalls his courtship of the woman who not only became his wife, but his business partner.

In 1964, while working as a flatware and textiles designer at Wallace Silversmith in Haverhill, he interviewed Charlotte for a job. Although immediately struck by her, it would take him two years to ask her out.

"She was a fantastic artist! In no time at all, I was absolutely in love with her," exclaimed Bill. "After a year of dating I asked her to marry me and was delighted (and somewhat shocked!) when she said yes."

In the early 70s, the pair started their own home-based design firm in Haverhill, Hallett & Associates. Although each maintained their own projects, they did everything as a team, including when Charlotte did some engraving work for Steuben Glass that's featured in the White House.



Soon, they were tapped to create artwork for Germany-based Hutschenreuther, widely considered to be one of the world's finest porcelain makers. "They treated us like royalty," said Bill. "We would design the artwork for the front of the plate, and they would produce it."

Traveling the globe with his wife was amazing, Bill says, but he is happy with his current corner of the world, as well. "One thing that really surprised me is how friendly everyone is (at Haverhill Crossings)," said Bill. "It's wonderful. You walk down the hall, and everyone says hello and asks you how you're doing. It's terrific, they really make you feel welcome."
